#### Learning Update

**Kindergarten -** Our kindergarten students are busy making new friends, learning classroom routines and rules, and navigating recess, lunch, and buses. There is so much to learn in the beginning of the new kindergarten year and students are "rocking it"! With September fast approaching, we are excited for the beginnings of our Reader's Workshop packed full of colorful picture books, traditional poetry, and sound-letter match.

Our Writing program will begin with the Launching of the Writer's workshop. Students will learn the rules and routines of being a "writer".

Math will focus on numbers, counting and sorting.

Science and social studies will help us to problem-solve and think like a scientist.

We are so excited to be back-to-school. We love learning and having fun together.


**1st Grade -** We are so excited to get this year started! Reading: To begin our year we will be working on building good habits as readers. We will drop our bad habits, and work on creating good habits. This means we check the picture, look at all the parts of the word, and do a double check. We will also be starting Reading Mastery and working on our decoding skills. Writing: Our first writing unit will be Personal Narratives. Our students love to tell stories, and

we love to hear them. They will write small moments and learn to use their voice in these narratives. We will also be working hard on spelling and grammar. As we work on our writing skills, we will also be working hard on our handwriting to form our letters correctly. Math: The first math unit we will be working on is numbers to 10. The goals of this chapter are to lead students to more efficient counting strategies with one-to-one correspondence, to read and write numbers in numerals and words, to compare the number of objects in two or more sets as well as to order numbers in ascending and descending orders.

**2nd Grade -** School is off to a great start this year in Second Grade! We have a new staff member named Mr. Perry. He is helping with all things second grade. The kids love working with him and he brings years of experience as both a teacher and an administrator to our group. He is already a favorite with the kids. This month, along with all our reading, writing, and math, we will be having some fall fun. To begin with, we will be learning how to play some of the "big kid" games like Four Square, Hopscotch, Jump Rope, and "500". Then, on September 23rd we will have some community members join us in the afternoon to help us explore nature and the community we live in.

**3rd Grade -** Third grade is off to a great start. We've learned all the rules, we know how to navigate the construction zone on the playground, and we are working on learning everyone's name. We are now jumping into curriculum. We start the year off with multiplication. When you find yourself in the car, or on a walk, or just sitting in the backyard, start skip-counting with your third grader. It's a great way to practice multiplication skills. We are also writing personal narratives. The kids always have fun writing about their summer adventures. Keep reading with your students at home. Third graders should be reading 20-30 minutes at home every day. It is going to be a great year!
