## Learning Update

Kindergarten - We had so much fun trying our best for the Turkey Trot! The best part was watching lots of teachers and coaches get pied! Kindergarteners will continue working on writing letters correctly and strengthening our phonemic awareness skills. Kindergarteners have begun a new writing unit called Show and Tell. During this unit we will work on paying close attention to details in illustrations to help "show" our readers something on each page. We are also working on adding more words to "tell" our readers about what is on each page.
In math, our mathematicians are working on comparing numbers by identifying which numbers are greater, less, or equal. We are continuing to review numbers $0-10$ with a focus on number recognition, number writing, counting, number order, and playing various number games. Soon, we will move on to teen numbers and add numbers 11-20 to these activities.
Between all of this hard work, we will manage to find time to spread some Holiday Cheer by attending Kindergarten Sing, School Sing, and various other Holiday activities. Happy Holidays!!

We have taught a couple science units. By the end of the year, each class will have rotated around to all the teachers for a total of six science units. In writing, we are now working on our opinion writing. We are sure that in a few short weeks, your students will be able to convince you of almost anything! We are wrapping up our unit on multiplication and division this month. Before Thanksgiving we hosted a Multiplication Carnival! Wow! That was a lot of math and a lot of fun! Please keep skip-counting and practicing math facts at home. Students need a lot of repetition in order to transfer the knowledge to long term memory.
