Learning Update

Kindergarten - Kindergarteners are continuing to learn new "heart words" and review how to read and write old heart words. We will keep adding new heart words to our word banks for the rest of the year! Kindergarteners will finish our informational writing unit by working on "How To" books! We will also work on implementing correct sentence structure into our writing. We are continuing to work on forming letters correctly while writing and playing word games through Heggerty. During Reading Workshop and Reading Mastery, we are working on our Super Powers! These powers include: Pointer Power or tracking the words with a finger, Reread Power or smoothing our voice out when we have to sound words out or read like a robot, and Sound Power or looking at each sound for every word.

For math we are beginning our operations unit! We are studying pictures to decide if the action is joining (addition) or leaving (subtraction/minus). We will practice acting out these stories, then we will practice telling them, and we will eventually begin using manipulatives, numbers and words, or number sentences to represent the action. We will continue to review numbers, number writing, counting, and shapes throughout the month as well.

1st Grade - Wow! We are so impressed with the growth our students are making. Throughout the month of March first grade students will be working on two digit addition and subtraction. Students are also working on place value and comparing numbers within 120. We are beginning an exciting reading unit. In this unit children will experience the power of story as they learn about empathy, imagination, envisionment, and prediction. Readers will track the events of a story, paying attention to the shifts in setting and the story events the characters experience. Students will begin to bring these ideas to their writing as we write realistic fiction. This unit is designed to teach students how to story tell and plan stories. Students will learn that characters in stories face problems, and then develop solutions. They will develop their own characters to use in the stories they create. In this unit they will deepen their partner work and continue to learn strategies to revise their writing. Children will be taught how to move from being accomplished storytellers to becoming accomplished writers of stories.

2nd Grade - We are so lucky to be teaching your child! Let's see if we can get a strong finish before our much needed spring break. We had such a fun time at the elk refuge!! The 2nd grade teachers also had an amazing time in Las Vegas learning about Kagan strategies to boost our teaching. We hope to implement some of the learned strategies and structures in our classrooms. In math this month we will be working on geometry and fractions. You can reinforce these skills by pointing out the 3D and 2D shapes you encounter at home and the fractions you might use when cooking together. We will also be learning more about adjectives and adverbs. Mad Libs are a fun way to practice these skills. In writing, most classrooms are working on various paragraph writing. As always, read, read, and read some more with your child. March celebrates literacy and we want to do the same!



3rd Grade - February was fun! It was Kindness Month, so we focused on recognizing all the CLASSY kids we have in third grade. We finished the month with a Kindness Luau for all students who got a Classy Ticket in the month of February! We rotated around classrooms for another science unit. By the end of the year, we'll have been through 6 units. We love science! Students have had the chance to spend their hard-earned school money to participate in a dodgeball tournament, learn how to make friendship bracelets, create sand art, and enter a poster contest. We celebrated the end of another reading period. We have some pretty amazing readers in third grade. In math, we finished our fractions unit and started working with graphs and data. We are learning more about picture graphs, bar graphs, and line plots. Those two step story problems are still hard, so we'll keep working on them! Keep reading and practicing math facts at home!

USE OF PERSONAL ELECTRONIC DEVICES:

At Afton Elementary School, we believe that academic and social development are essential to every child's educational experience. The use of personal electronic devices in school, such as cell phones and smart watches, can significantly disrupt the pursuit of these goals. In order to minimize these distractions, the following information outlines Afton Elementary School's policy for student use of personal electronic devices.

- A personal electronic device shall be defined as an electronic device brought from home to school. Some examples include cell phones, smart watches, tablets, devices that have capabilities of taking photos and/or recording audio or connectivity to WiFi, and portable gaming systems.
- 2. Personal electronic devices shall not be used by students on school grounds, during school hours for the purpose of sending/receiving phone calls or text messages, taking photos/videos, and gaming. Exceptions include:
 - Medical devices approved by school administration.
 - The use of smart watches shall be limited only to their utility as a watch to tell time (parents of students who wear a smart watch are strongly encouraged to utilize available controls that disable other features during school hours).
 - As otherwise directed by school administration or staff.
- 3. Telecommunication between students and parents shall be facilitated using a school phone in the office or classroom.
- 4. Violation of this policy will result in the following actions:
 - First offense warning.
 - Second offense device relocated to the office for students to retrieve at the end of the school day.
 - Third offense device relocated to the office for parents to retrieve.

Parents, our annual Early Childhood Census is now happening! We ask

that you go to www.lscd2.org and click on the link provided or use this QR Code or direct link to access the census and fill it out for any of your children who are birth to 5 years old and not enrolled in kindergarten yet. The district uses this information to plan for future needs of our schools and to get important information to you the year before your child will enter kindergarten. In January, there will be a census worker in your area that will contact you if you have not filled out the census online. The census will be open now through January 25.
